Hands-on Activity

Your Own Quiet Spot

Locate and describe a quiet spot near where you live. Then direct someone to that exact spot without talking them there.

What You Need

- peep or rubber duck near your home
- pencil
- paper and ruler
- journal
- small object

What You Do

1. With adult supervision, find the quietest spot near where you live. Go to that location.
2. In your journal, write all of the noises you hear over a 15-minute time span. Note if they are human noises or noises from nature.
3. After 15 minutes in this quiet spot, if you don't think it is quiet enough from human noise, find another location that is quiet. Repeat step 2 in the new location. Pick the spot that is the quietest.
4. Put a small, special object in the very quietest one-inch location in your quiet spot.
5. Create a map to the location. Write the directions beginning at your house. Include visual markers that will lead a person right to your one-inch location.
6. Give the directions to someone and see if he or she can follow your directions and find your quiet spot.

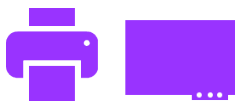
